Application Requirements

1) To be considered for graduate admission, applicants must have completed an appropriate university-level program. The fact that a degree in another country may have a similar name to a degree in the United States does not necessarily mean the degree can be accepted as equivalent. 2) The student must have sufficient proficiency in English, as determined by the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) to study in classes conducted entirely in English. 3) The student must have made financial arrangements which allow for approximately \$19,200 per year for tuition, supplies, and living expenses.

Application Procedure

The entire admission application must be completed and submitted with a thirty dollar (\$30) application processing fee. This fee, in the form of check, money order, or bank draft, must be made payable to Wayne State University and carry the notation "payable in US. funds, plus service charges." The fee is not refundable under any circumstances. The applicant's name should appear on the bank draft or money order so that proper credit can be given.

It is also necessary that official transcripts or mark sheets of ALL university level grades be sent by the issuing institution to the Office of University Admissions. The transcript must show a record of subjects taken, grades, and degrees earned. The unit or credit hours earned for each course should also be listed. The information should be as complete as possible since additional correspondence will delay the processing of the application. It is not necessary to submit secondary school records. All academic documents should be submitted in English and the native language.

Verification of Degrees

Official documents must show the degree title and date of award. If the applicant is presently a candidate for a degree, no final admission decision can be made until the transcript with a degree statement is received by the Office of University Admissions. Until a transcript with a degree statement is available, an official statement from the school or college verifying that all requirements for the degree have been completed and stating the date when the degree will be awarded is acceptable on a temporary basis.

English Proficiency

All applicants are required to submit evidence of proficiency in English to the Office of University Admission. A minimum score of 550 is required on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), or a score of 85 is required on the Michigan test (MELAB). The TOEFL Bulletin of Information and Registration form is available at many US. embassies, consulates, and USIA offices. If not available from these sources write: TOEFL, P.O. Box 6155, Princeton, New Jersey 08541-6155, U.S.A.

Applicants Seeking Teaching Assistantships

Applicants must also demonstrate acceptable skills in spoken English. Such applicants should take the Test of Spoken English (TSE) offered at TOEFL test centers. Test results should be sent by the Educational Testing Service to the Chairperson of the academic department at Wayne State University. For information about the test write to: Test of Spoken English, P.O. Box 2882, Princeton, NJ 08541-2882, U.S.A. If the TSE cannot be taken, it is recommended that the applicant correspond with the chairperson of the department from which financial support is being requested.

Application Filing Dates

The Office of University Admissions will make every effort to process your application in time for the semester of your choice. However, we have developed the deadline dates shown below which will ensure a decision before the semester starts. Unless your application and all supporting materials are received by the date indicated, we may not have time to consider you for the desired term. In addition, **several programs have firm deadlines which are earlier than those listed (see "department/college/school information" inside)**. Please note that this application is only applicable for the semester you indicate on the enclosed graduate application. If you do not register for classes within that semester you need to complete a Renewal Application for the next consecutive semester.

Other Requirements

Many departments require other tests or additional materials such as letters of recommendation. Consult the admission application instructions for departmental requirements. Failure to satisfy these requirements will delay a final decision on the request for admission.

Registration Procedures

If admitted, the student will receive a Certificate of Eligibility (I-20 or IAP-66) with the official letter of admission. This Certificate is required before a visa from the United States embassy or consulate can be issued. The applicant should not leave the home country before receiving official notification of admission from the Office of Graduate Admissions.

Types of Programs

The degree(s) or certificate available in each major is indicated under the department/college/school information section of the application by a letter code following the name of the major.

M - Master's (M.A., M.S., or other) S - Specialist Certificate
D - Doctorate (Ph.D. and/or Ed.D.) C - Graduate Certificate

Copies of Documents

Photocopies of original documents must bear the signature of the registrar and the seal of the issuing institution -- the signature and seal must be original and separate from the photographic image. Attested or "true" copies are acceptable only if certified by signature and seal of an administrative official of the school in which the studies were completed. The application must have the signature of the applicant or of your local consul.

ECE Evaluations

We recommend that applicants with credentials from countries outside of North America submit transcripts to Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE) for evaluation for transfer and equivalency purposes. Contact ECE at P.O. Box 92970, Milwaukee, WI 53202-0970 or call (414) 289-3400.

Important Notice Concerning Proficiency in English

Applicants from English-Speaking Countries: Applicants who are citizens of English-speaking countries and who speak English as their first (native) language are exempted from submitting proficiency results, subject to the discretion of the Office of Admissions.

Students Applying from Other Countries:

- 1. Official application and \$30.00 application fee payable in U.S. funds.
- 2. Certified English translations of all University transcripts required by the University. Must bear seal/stamp of the issuing institution. No other verification will be accepted.
- 3. Official transcripts in native language. Official degree certificates in English and native language.
- 4. Signed Statement of Financial Support. (This cannot be more than six months old).
- 5. Supporting bank documentation indicating a minimum of \$19,200 available for the first year. Canadian students commuting from Windsor, Ontario need only document support for tuition and school supplies (\$7,250). Bank documentation must show equivalent dollar amount and cannot be more than six months old.
- 6. T.O.E.F.L. score of 550 or more. Score cannot be more than 2 years old. (If you hold a Bachelor or Master's Degree from a U.S. or Canadian institution, you are exempted from this requirement.)
- 7. Signed photograph. (Only one is needed)
- 8. If you are currently holding a non-immigrant visa (H1, B1, F2, TN, etc.), please include a photo copy of your visa documents.

Transfer Students from American Universities/Colleges:

- 1. Official transcripts forwarded directly from all institutions attended in English and native language. Official degree certificate in English and native language.
- 2. Current Affidavit of Support. (This cannot be more than six months old).
- 3. Current supporting bank documentation indicating a minimum of \$19,200 available. (This cannot be more than six months old). Statement must show equivalent dollar amount.
- 4. T.O.E.F.L. of 550 or more (cannot be more than 2 years old) or Wayne State University English Language Institute test.
- 5. Signed photograph. (Only one is needed).
- 6. Non-immigrant Visa Status Verification Form accompanied by I-20 (copy).
- 7. Official application and \$30.00 application fee payable in U.S. funds.

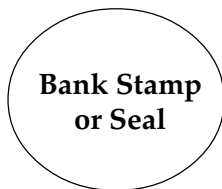

STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

(Required of all applicants seeking a Student or Exchange Visitor Student Status)

It is necessary that the information requested below be provided since very few students receive financial support from the University and immigration laws severely limit or prohibit employment in the United States for students holding a temporary visa (F-1, J-1).

As Wayne State University is a tax supported institution, some forms of financial aid are reserved for legal residents of the State. Normally, graduate students from abroad are eligible to apply for scholarships, fellowships, and graduate assistantships only after having demonstrated exceptionally good academic progress during the first year of their graduate study. However, some departments award graduate assistantships to foreign applicants at the time of admission; please consult with the chairperson of the department in which you intend to major. Most assistantships do not cover costs for an entire calendar year. Proof of additional funds from other sources listed below may be necessary before a certificate of eligibility for a student visa can be sent.

At the present time, it is estimated that a non-resident should expect to provide approximately \$19,200 for each year of study (two semesters or eight months and a four month summer period) in addition to all transportation costs.
