This application may be used for freshman and transfer undergraduate admission and for second bachelor degrees only. International, Graduate, Guest, Concurrent, Post-Bachelor or Macomb University Center Admission require special applications for admission. All Applicants

- Complete the application and attach the non-refundable \$20 application fee (check or money order payable to Wayne State University). Please include your social security number. Cash is not accepted.
- To be considered for resident status for tuition assessment purposes, a student must have resided in Michigan for six (6) continuous months as of the first day of classes. For a detailed explanation of the residency requirements, refer to the residency section in the WSU Bulletin.

Transcripts

- Request official transcripts from ALL post secondary colleges attended. Transcripts must be sent directly from the college to Wayne State. Transcripts that are hand-carried, even in a sealed envelope or attached to the application are unofficial and cannot be used for admission.
- Note to all students presently taking classes at any educational institution other than Wayne State University: If there is course work in progress at the time admission is granted, please remember to send or bring a final transcript to the Admissions Office.
- When sending any documents to Wayne State, please request that each document contains your full name and, if possible, your social security number. Send all information to the address provided.

Freshman

- Freshman admission requirements are a 2.75 (B-) grade point average or a 2.00-2.74 grade point average with an ACT composite of 21 or an SAT total of 970. GED holders must score a 45 average AND a 21 ACT.
- Be certain to tell your high school to send Wayne State a transcript after your final grades and graduation is posted.
- Current high school students should give the completed application, with fee attached, to the high school counselor for his or her signature. He or she may mail it, along with a copy of your high school transcript and ACT or SAT scores, to the Office of University Admissions.
- If you have already graduated, please submit the application and contact your high school to have your transcript sent to the Office of University Admissions.
- Current high school students with a 3.5 or higher grade point average will automatically be considered for the Presidential Scholarship. Following notification of admission, a scholarship offer is sent to those selected. Final notifications may be made through March 31.

Transfer

- The transfer admission requirements are 12 or more transferable academic semester hours (18 quarter hours) and at least a cumulative 2.00 grade point average. Professional programs of study may have additional requirements. Please see the section on *Professional School Information and Admission Requirements*.
- Applicants with fewer than 12 transferrable academic semester hours must also request an official copy of the high school transcript or GED with accompanying ACT or SAT test scores.
- For the best opportunity for admission we recommend that you apply six to eight months prior to the semester you expect to begin at Wayne State University.
- Advanced Placement or CLEP tests must be sent from the testing agency to: Office of University Admissions, Wayne State University, Detroit, MI 48202.
- Applicants on probation with less than a 2.00 GPA or who have been excluded from another college, are asked to wait one calendar year before applying for admission. At that time, the transfer requirements must be met.

Does my admission give me financial aid?

No. Admission to the university must be granted before financial aid can be awarded. To apply for aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The form is available from the WSU Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid, 3 West Helen Newberry Joy, SSC, Detroit MI 48202. (313) 577-3378.

Apply for financial aid early. Aid is awarded beginning in April for the following academic year which begins in September.

I have a 1.8 GPA from another college. Can I be admitted to Wayne State?

Not at this time. You must have a minimum 2.0 GPA and 12 transferable semester hours to be admitted to WSU. We do not admit students under a probationary status. We suggest that you attend a local community college to raise your GPA. The Office of University Admissions can provide lists of courses that will transfer from the nine area community colleges. Please call our office for this equivalency table and for a copy of our publication, "Options for Your Future." This brochure will outline options available to gain future admission to WSU.

I am a permanent resident. What documents do I have to submit?

Please submit a copy of your permanent resident card (both sides) with the application. If your native language is not English, you must also provide proof of English proficiency. Acceptable proof includes a TOEFL score of 550 or MELAB score of 85 as well as a TWE score of 5.5 OR successful completion of the Wayne State University English Language Institute program.

I attended Wayne State in the past. Do I have to be admitted again.

No. If you were admitted and registered for classes in a degree seeking program, simply contact the WSU Records Office, (313) 577-3531, to have your status updated. If you were admitted as a Guest student you will need to apply for admission.

Can I take Honors classes at Wayne State?

Freshmen students with a high school G.P.A. of 3.5 (or higher) or an ACT score of 26 (or higher) are automatically eligible to take Honors classes. Community college or university transfer students must have above

a 3.3 G.P.A. overall in college coursework to be eligible for the Honors Program. All Wayne State University Presidential Scholars are automatically eligible to take Honors coursework.

How do I get to Wayne State University?

If you are unsure how to get to Wayne State, just follow the easy directions below. They will get you to the center of campus parking areas.

From the NORTH: Take the Lodge Freeway (US-10) south to Forest exit, east on Forest to Lodge Service Drive, north on Lodge Service Drive to Warren, east on Warren to Anthony Wayne Drive, north on Anthony Wayne Drive. Or, take I-75 south to Warren exit, west on Warren to Anthony Wayne Drive, north on Anthony Wayne Drive.

From the WEST: Take I-94 east to the Lodge Freeway exit, go south on Lodge to Forest exit. Follow service drive up to Forest. East on Forest to Lodge Service Drive, north on Lodge Service Drive to Warren, east on Warren to Anthony Wayne Drive, north on Anthony Wayne Drive.

From the SOUTH: Take the Lodge Freeway north to Forest exit, north on Lodge Service Drive to Warren, east on Warren to Anthony Wayne Drive, north on Anthony Wayne Drive.

From the EAST: Take I-94 to Woodward Avenue exit, follow service drive to Cass, south on Cass to Palmer, west on Palmer to Anthony Wayne Drive, south on Anthony Wayne Drive.

Campus parking structures require a parking card to exit. You can purchase a parking card from the parking structure on the first floor.
